17 goals, 169 targets, over 250 indicators







































## WATER and SANITATIONfocus during the MDGs phase

#### WHY A PARALLEL PROCESS WITH SDGs?



- SDGs are not just about Water. The Decade is
- SDGs still focus on a limited number of targets and narrowly-focused indicators (11 in case of SDG6). They do not cover the whole spectrum of water issues nationally and globally
- Many are confident that much more needs to be done to advance the water agenda. The UN "Water Decade Resolution" of 2016 was supported by over 170 Member States


- Action Plan developed by UN-Water on request of UN Secretary General (SG)



# IAHS INITIATIVE: UNSOLVED PROBLEMS IN HYDROLOGY



- IAHS UN-Water partner; Thousands of members worldwide
- 2017: Call to Global Hydrological Community "23 unsolved problems for 21-st Century"
- 2018: 16 "gold" and 29 "silver" candidate problems identified
- May need more focus on major problems and [explicit] alignment with SDGs
- Fits perfectly with the Water Action Decade



## THE HIGH-LEVEL PANEL ON WATER (HLPW)



- Convened by the UN Secretary General and the World Bank Group President, with 11 sitting Heads of State
- Mandate raise <u>political awareness</u> of water issues to the highest level
- 2018 Outcome Document- released before the launch of the Decade to support it with 3 main groups of recommendations:
  - Foundation: data + value + governance
  - Integration: at local, country and regional levels
  - Cooperation at global level, innovation, increased finances (e.g. at least a double water infrastructure investment in the next 5 years)

#### **Objectives**

- Review current situation and trends worldwide
- Provide data on global baseline status of SDG 6
- Explore the linkages between SDG 6 and other SDGs
- Discuss ways to accelerate achieving SDG 6

#### Added value

- UN speaking with one voice on SDG 6
- Avoids a fragmented approach on SDG 6 reporting
- Analyses information and policy linkages between different SDGs
- Key fact-based messages on the Progress with SDG6 to date

#### What next


- Public dialog ongoing

- Possibly repeated after X years







- Increased visibility show how to resolve big challenges with limited resources and over shortterm




## HOW CAN GWF CONTRIBUTE



- GWF is the major water research program ever happened in Canada natural lead of a national contribution to Action Decade
- Build a "Canada Water" network around GWF – to speak internationally with one – Canadian – voice; at least for Water Research
- Focus more on science-policy bridging
- Demonstrate how to resolve <u>nationally</u> at least one chronic <u>global</u> water problem
