Why Prairie Water?

- > 5.5 million people
- 80% of Canada's agricultural land (\$116 billion industry)
- Intensive land use
- A challenging climate
- Significant management and governance challenges:
 - a) lake eutrophication
 - b) wetland drainage
 - c) water availability and quality
 - d) groundwater sustainability



Key Outcomes

- 1) Predictions of water availability and quality under different climatic and land use scenarios across the Prairies.
- Assessments of groundwater resources and management using linked surface – subsurface models
- B) Multi-stakeholder process to mobilize science and governance models with communities to improve resiliency


