Master Agreement on Apportionment





- MAA signed in 1969 by governments of Canada, Alberta, Saskatchewan, & Manitoba
 - Apportions eastern flowing waters
 - 1992 added Agreement on Water Quality
- Re-established the Prairie Provinces Water Board
 - 5 members: 2 Canada, 1 each AB, SK, MB

PPWB Mandate



- Monitoring the apportionment water of eastward flowing transboundary streams and lakes
- Monitoring the achievement of transboundary water quality objectives
- Address transboundary groundwater issues
- Conduct studies
- Provide a forum for cooperation and collaboration






PPWB Interests – Water Quality
